- Chris Conley
  - o Public Hearings: Early voting and absentee ballots
  - o Governor's budget going to the Appropriations and Finance Committees
  - Next month to the end of late April will be in meetings. Budget has to be finalized by June 7, 2023 by 12 a.m.
  - o If you have any questions or concerns, contact her
  - o Reval pilot when property values go down, less pilot money
  - o ECS funding currently at no losses, Governor did not fund it using the new ECS funding
  - Was thanked for getting free school meals for students
  - Question regarding the mold bill.
  - O Discussed the bill to cap fees to non residents at town beaches. (This does not affect Groton City or New London) Some towns charge non residents very high fees.
- Mayor's Report Juan Melendez
  - Last meeting voted on the RTM redistricting; will add 2 additional seats -41 to 43.
  - o Groton Long Point Bridge will be using Federal (80 %) and State (20%) funds
  - o ARPA distribution finalized. Going to the RTM Finance Committee
  - Mystic Parking Study video is on GMTV channel as well as Claude Chester plan also on Town website. Members should weigh in using these.
  - o If interested in vacant seat on Council, email <u>council@groton-ct.gov</u>
  - o Budget sessions will be starting soon
- ♦ BOE Beverly is out of town and Matthew is at the BOE meeting to adopt budget. No report

**Presentation** Bob Frink, Chair, Groton Housing Authority, Nancy Codeanne, Board member. Both GDTC members.

- ♦ Housing for low to moderate income households (seniors over 62 and/or those who are on disability)
- ❖ Under the State's Authority. Land was donated by Town. State paid to build the units, 50 years ago.
- ♦ Has five commissioners (1 is a resident of GHA)
- ❖ 2 Properties: Grasso Gardens and Pequot Village 164 units, studios,, one bedrooms only. Tiny!
- ♦ Base rents are \$350-550 month Units are in need or renovations! Funding for that is limited.

- GHA has built some new units, with solar, geothermal, all the modern conveniences. 2 bedrooms.
- ❖ Have a Two and a half year waiting list
- Available to give tours. website: grotonhousingauthority.org
- Small staff. Volunteer opportunities.
- ♦ Meetings are open to the public. Come, listen and learn.
- ❖ GHA has projects going forward to add additional units of affordable housing in Groton. Would like to pursue "Pocket Communities" on sites like some of the closed school properties.
